He will be representing the District and the Institution of Fire Engineers USA Branch during a study trip to the Polish National Fire Academy, September 26-October 6, 2016. 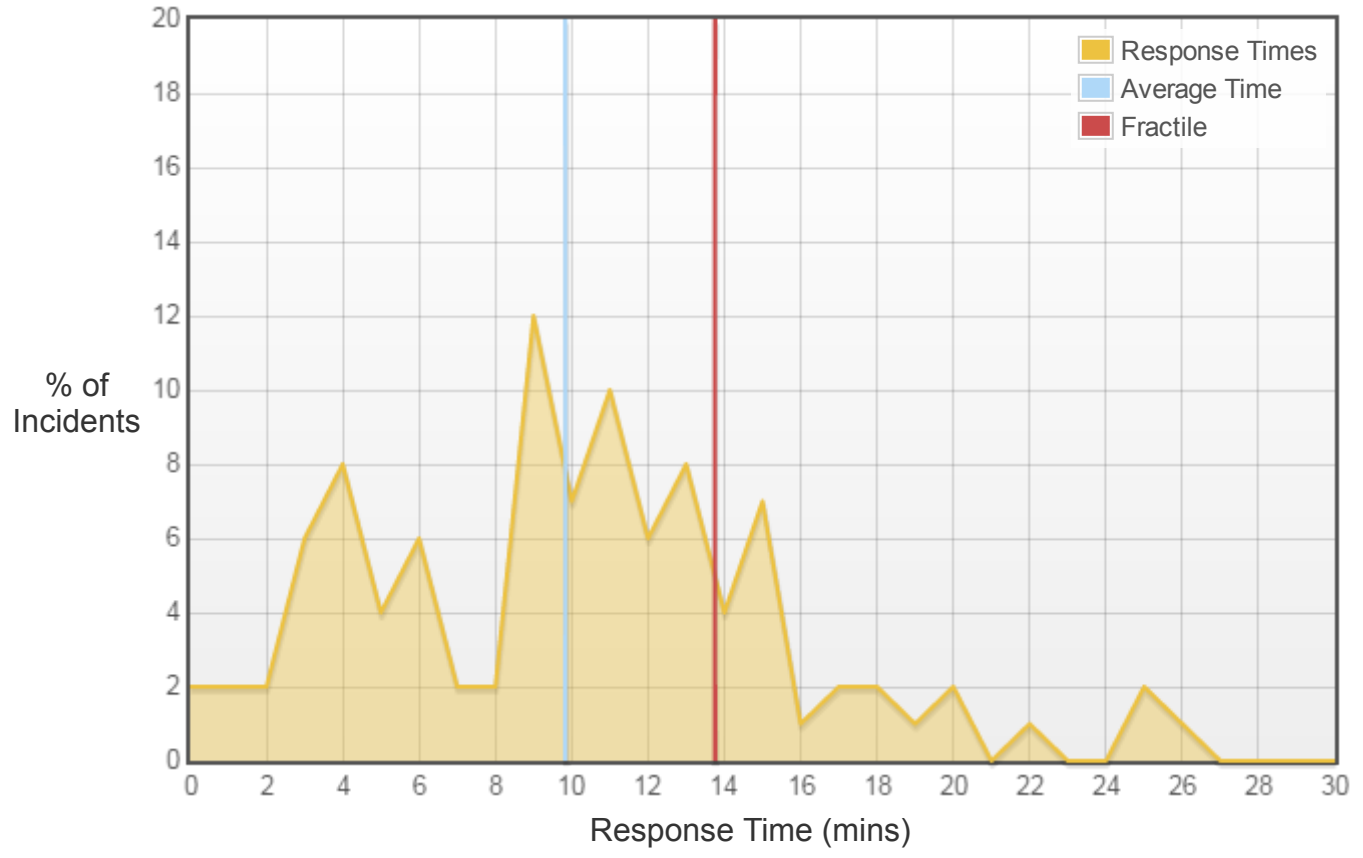
